

TGM GRANTS FOR 2011

Is your community trying to make it safer for students to walk or bike to school? Interested in creating a better bicycle-pedestrian network? In updating your Transportation System Plan or Downtown Improvement Plan? In expanding local transportation options to soften the impact of future gas price hikes and reduce greenhouse gas emissions?

The Oregon Transportation and Growth Management Program (TGM) can help! A new round of grants will soon be available to local governments in Oregon to support these and other planning activities. TGM grants typically range from \$75,000 to \$150,000. Grants require an 11% local match. TGM also offers educational workshops and technical assistance on a variety of transportation- and land use-related topics, including school siting. Local governments and school districts can collaborate on TGM projects.
