When COVID closed school buildings, I cofounded Pack With Pride which was a popup food pantry serving families in the Tigard-Tualatin School District. At its peak need, PWP was distributing 850 food boxes weekly to families in need as well as matching those boxes with USDA food boxes. It was an outstanding model of gathering leaders to make a difference for those with the greatest needs.

- 1) Addressing/supporting the long-term impacts from the pandemic: staff shortages, burnout, student academic achievement and mental health.
