CREDIT FOR PROFICIENCY	
In addition to credit by completing classroom or equivalent working as in a course of at least 130 clock hours, a student may receive credit toward a diploma or a modified diploma based on any one or more of the following options levels in which the student demonstrates proficiency or mastery of recognized standards through:	OAR 581-022-1131

CYBERBULLYING	
The public charter school prohibits any form of harassment, intimidation or bullying, through electronic means, which is known as cyberbullying. A student may be subject to discipline, up to and including expulsion, for a violation. A student may also be referred to law enforcement for a violation. Student or volunteers may report cyberbullying anonymously. Remedial action shall not be based solely on an anonymous report. DAMAGE TO PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL PROPERTY	1
A student who is found to have damaged public charter school property will be held responsible for the reasonable cost of repairing or replacing that property. [If the cost is \$50 or more, the public charter school will notify the student and parent.] [The public charter school will notify students and parents of all such charges.] If the amount due is not paid within 10 calendar days of receipt of the public charter school's notice, the amount will become a debt owed and certain penalties and/or restrictions may be imposed. See Fee, Fines and Charges.	Notice required  Coordinate with Board policies ECAB - Vandalism/ Malicious Mischief/Theft and JFCB - Care of Public Charter School Property by Students.  Such debts must be processed by the public charter school as described in Fees, Fines and Charges. Such charges and notification of amounts of \$50 or more are now required. If the amount is less than \$50, charge and notification is optional. In collecting debt under this new law, public charter school may also seek reasonable attorney fees if court action is necessary.
